THE GEORGE HULL EARLYON PROGRAM DESCRIPTIONS

Family Drop-In (o to 6 years of age)

A wonderful opportunity for children and their family to participate in early learning activities and to enjoy the use of play materials, equipment and resources. This program is designed to encourage quality adult and child interactions in an age-appropriate, child-focused environment that enhances and promotes healthy child development

123 Let's Move (Indoor Movement) (Birth to 6 years of age)

The focus of this program is all about using our large muscles. We will be working on mastering gross motor skills like dancing, balancing, jumping, kicking and running. It is also a great way to burn off that extra energy.

Sensory Play

This program welcomes children and their families to experience play through the use of their senses. Each week we will focus on one sense such as tactile, sound, sight, smell, taste as well as vestibular (balance) and proprioceptive input (using muscles). Children will have the opportunity to enhance their senses through crafts, group time with songs and finger plays and age appropriate activities.

Baby's World (Birth to 12 months)

This program welcomes parents/caregivers to experience the joy of sharing songs, rhymes and musical activities with their infants. Families will have the opportunity to socialize, ask questions, and share helpful hints or strategies with each other while spending quality time with their babies. This program offers resources and services available within the community.

Infant and Toddler Time (Birth to 24 months)

This program welcomes parents/caregivers to experience the joy of moving their bodies through songs, rhymes, finger plays, and musical activities with their infants and toddlers. Families will have the opportunity to socialize, ask questions, and share helpful hints or strategies with each other while spending quality time with their children.

First Steps- Group 1

A group designed for young children aged 30 months and younger to enhance communication, interaction, and language skills. We will collaborate with parents to implement effective strategies for expanding your child's communication and interaction abilities, while fostering various forms of communication (speech, gestures, pictures, and technology). Parents/caregivers will play an active role in the group, which will feature activities like singing, reading, free play, crafting, and sensory play. Our team consists of a Speech Language Pathologist, a Communication Disorders Assistant, and an Early Childhood Educator.
