Our Centre is currently looking for a Director of Prevention & Early Intervention Services (PEI) to join our management team. The Director is responsible for providing strategic leadership to Prevention and Early Intervention Department, including the development and delivery of services in the following programs: Etobicoke Brighter Futures Coalition, Toronto Family Group Conferencing Program, Family Group Conferencing Ontario Provincial Resource, EarlyON Child & Family Centre, Every Child Belongs, and Preschool Speech & Language Services. This position plays a critical role by ensuring service excellence, innovation, and integration across these programs while building strong community partnerships and sectoral alliances.

The successful candidate will be passionate about supporting children and their families and driven by the opportunity to create meaningful change. They should also possess a strong understanding of the unique needs and challenges of working in the nonprofit sector.

Key Responsibilities:

- Lead the development and delivery of flexible and inclusive programming across all assigned services.
- Oversee program evaluation, research, and continuous quality improvement initiatives.
- Ensure compliance with policies, budget accountability, and alignment with service plans.
- Provide oversight and supervision for clinical services in Early Abilities and Every Child Belongs.
- Ensure professional standards are upheld and provide clinical consultation and leadership as needed.
- Supervise a team of eight direct reports, including program managers, coordinators, and administrative staff.
- Lead performance management, professional development, and team-building initiatives.
- Promote continuous learning through internal education and student placement programs in relevant fields.
- Stay current with best practices and emerging research in children's mental health

and early intervention.

- Represent the Centre on city-wide leadership tables and inter-agency committees.
- Build partnerships with service providers and lead collaborative projects within the community.
- Initiate and lead innovative special projects in collaboration with internal teams and community agencies.
- Seek grant and foundation funding to support service innovation and sustainability.

Qualifications and Skills

- Post-graduate degree in a human services field.
- Registration with a relevant regulatory college (e.g., Ontario College of Social Workers and Social Service Workers).
- Extensive leadership experience in children's services, mental health, or communitybased settings.
- In-depth knowledge of key legislation including the **Child**, **Youth and Family Services Act**, **Health Care Consent Act**, and **Child Care and Early Years Act**.
- Strong planning, clinical supervision, and administrative skills.
- Demonstrated ability to build and sustain high-performing, multidisciplinary teams.
- Excellent interpersonal, written, and verbal communication skills.
